

CONTESTING

- SDWS is now one of the leading contesting teams in the UK
- It has been successful in all areas of the spectrum from 160m to microwaves.
- Some of our operators are in the top echelon of UK contesting, especially at VHF and up.
- All this success raises awareness of SDWS in amateur circles around the UK and further afield.



CONTESTING

<u>UK Activity Contests</u>: We ceased to take part in these a couple of years ago to reduce the load on members. A few of us occasionally submit UKAC logs to the 807 Group in return for some of their members "batting" for us in the AFS Superleague and the VHF Championships

RSGB 80m Club Contest 2021:

SDWS finished 6th out of 52 clubs in Local Club league section.

G3PHO, G4N (G4ZVB) and G0HSA in top 30 of UK individual scores out of a field of 387 entries.

VHF Championships 2021: SDWS finished 2nd out of 95 clubs + 11 contests

RSGB AFS Super League (HF to UHF): SDWS 5th out of 60 club entries

VHF Field Day: DID NOT ENTER!

SSB Field Day: SDWS has not entered this event since 2016


The exams were also held online. The practical tests were waived by RSGB and Ofcom.



RECENT CHANGES AT THE RUTLAND

- I. SDWS has a policy of no subscriptions
- 2. Rutland Hotel new management at end of 2017 brought changes
- 3. We have been paying £50 per night for room hire for the past few years. Since we could not afford to hire four times a month, the Committee decided to book a room for 10 Wednesdays a year, one a month, except in July and August when we have outdoor activities
- 4. All other Wednesdays were, until Covid, social evenings based in the Public Bar
- 5. New Rutland management agreed to a 5% discount on all drinks and food on production of i.d in the form of an SDWS membership/discount card but that is now not available.



For SDWS to continue meeting at the Rutland ...

- We need to raise at least £500 a year for room hire charges + approx £50 for RSGB Affiliation. We will need this input year after year.
- This money can be raised by (a) Voluntary donations and (b) Fundraising events such as junk sales.
- These amounts of cash made opening a club bank account essential. Donations can be paid into it by Bank Transfer.
- The Rutland have agreed to two @ six monthly payments in advance: Sept £300 (6 meetings) and March £200 (4 meetings)
- PLEASE SUPPORT SDWS with your donations!
